Sporting Opportunities

Daily Mile

Parents of foundation pupils who are running are allowed around to the playground, as they need to take them to their classroom for the start of lessons. Please stay on the benches as you first enter the playground and keep preschool children close to you.

Pupils, including siblings, who are not doing the mile must wait at the front gates with their parents as we do not have appropriate supervision on the playground.

We hope your child gives it a go! The teachers can see the benefits it is having! On Tuesday and Thursday all the children do the mile within the school day.
