Last term, I took part in the Autism Education Trust's audit for all schools to assess our competency in meeting the needs for pupils with autism http://www.autismeducationtrust.org.uk/. This was provided through DSPL3 (Delivering Special Provision Locally <u>http://dspl3.co.uk/about-dspl3/</u>) which is a vital resource for me and has fantastic information for parents. I was delighted to share this document with a parent and also a member of staff (as per the guidelines). The audit highlighted the need for staff training that is specific to what we see in our school and more 'bespoke' than a general awareness. I am pleased to inform you that all teachers and some TAs received training from Sheila Kitchen and Alison Lindsell from Amwell View this week. The feedback from staff was very positive and they were able to engage with the trainers to gain further knowledge in specific areas of need. Continuing on from this, I was also able to attend the course 'Good Autism Practice' with an SEN TA yesterday which was provided by advisory teachers from the Communication and Autism team and Educational Psychologists. All of this specific training has strengthened our knowledge and added to our 'toolkit of resources' to support our children and we continue to look for ways to improve our understanding. Look out for our participation in World Autism Week which is coming up in March.
