## **School Lunches**

At the end of last term the children will have brought home individual letters detailing the amount owing for school meals up to the 9th February 2018.

If your child if off sick, please leave a **telephone** message on the school's dedicated absence line (option 1) on each day of absence. Pre-arranged absences can be advised in writing or by email (e.g. appointments) but all other absences need to be reported by telephone. Thank you
