## **Headteacher's News**

In union with two other local schools, the whole school are taking part in a writing project called 'Wild'. The aim of this is to help develop a range of different writing skills in our chil-

dren. The children are studying a book called Wild by Emily Hughes, which is about a girl who has known nothing but nature since she was born. Bears taught her to eat, birds to speak and foxes to play; she is

unabashedly, irrefutably, irrepressibly Wild! We know that the children at Northgate will benefit greatly from this enrichment.

Mud glorious mud! In Reception this week, as part of our Forest School, the children have been inspired by our whole school writing project. They had fun sculpting mud faces and sticking them to the trees. They connected with the natural environment and foraged for objects to add features to the faces such as stones for eyes and grass for hair. Today Year 5, enjoyed a STEM DT construction



challenge run by Davinder Singh Reehal, a qualified structural engineer. Children had to design, draw and build a bulldozer using K'nnex. The children loved this creative project and built some amazing constructions. The designs were judged for presentation, communication and teamwork, problem solving, operation, function and design. The teams gained additional points for extra features. The winning designers received a medal and certificate and have been entered into a nationwide competition. Well done to Bea, Martha and Orla in Class 9.



visited the Bishops Stortford College for a STEM science workshop. Evie and Rose explained that they watched some exciting experiments involving dry ice, in which they learned how hot and cold temperatures affects the speed of its release. The group watched how the chemical acetone reacts on polystyrene and they took part in an experiment about gravity involving a leaf blower and a plastic ball. They really enjoyed it.
