Highlights of Science Week

At Northgate, we use aim to creative approach to the teaching and learning of Science, with practical activities, investigations and experiments an integral part of the learning of Science. We aim to embed the principles of scientific enquiry and hope this week has helped to secure our vision of Northgate being a vibrant and innovative place for our children to learn.

Year 1

We have done lots of science in Year One this week. We have investigated air rockets and fizzy paint. We also experimented with how to





keep 'dinosaur blood' frozen by wrapping it in different materials. Our scientist to focus on was Mary Anning and we found out about her life as well as handling some real fossils.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a very exciting Science Week and enjoyed a practical bubble workshop. The children explored different ways of blowing bubbles and experimented with everyday





objects to see what shape bubbles they could blow. They had great fun blowing huge bubbles outside!

Fab Science led 'potty potions' on Tuesday, as classes were treated to some fabulous science experiments. Children investigated purple cabbage water to discover whether mystery liquids were acids or alkalis. Children were treated


to washing their hair in clouds and finally treated to fountains of carbonated drink infused with mint imperials! A fabulous experience for all!
