Enriching the curriculum

On Monday, Year 3 enjoyed their Greek Day as part of their new topic. The children and teachers came into school dressed up in the most amazing costumes. They started the morning listening to relaxing Greek instrumental music while they looked at examples of beautiful Hoplon shields carried by Ancient Greek soldiers. They then designed their own shields. The children also studied the Greek alphabet and wrote their names in Greek, and practised Greek dancing in the hall. Each class made a tasty Greek Salad by chopping tomatoes, onion, cucumbers, feta cheese and olives, which they ate this as part of a Greek feast later in the afternoon. Thank you to the teachers for providing the children with a real taste of life as an ancient Greek.



This week EYFS had a delivery of duck eggs. The eggs arrived in an incubator to begin with then over a period of 24 hours the eggs have hatched out and are now all in a pen with their siblings. School uniform

Please ensure that your child wears black shoes to school (no boots). Apart from PE days, children are not permitted to wear trainers, this includes black trainers. The children must wear bottle green jumpers/cardigans. EYFS this term may wear yellow or green jumpers as they transition to green for the autumn term. These can be purchased from Tesco, Amazon or Next among other sellers. We will soon have details on a new uniform supplier; we are just finalising details with them and will let you know shortly. Year 5 and 6 should be wearing ties with a white shirt. These can be purchased for £4.50 form the school office. PE kits warn should be green joggers/shorts and a white t-shirt, with green hoodies for cold days. All hair accessories must be bottle green or yellow.

Medication forms

If your child needs to have medication administered at school, a medical form must be filled out online via our school website. Please note that we will only administer medicine that is required four times a day (three times a day this can be given to the children before school, after school and before bed). It is essential that the medication is brought in, in its original box with labels and insert . Thank you.

Please check your child's hair over the weekend for signs of headlice, as we have been notified of a case in school. Please administer a treatment if required.
