Science Award

This academic year we are working towards achieving the Primary Science Quality Mark. As part of this, teachers have been working hard to develop science teaching in Northgate to be more effective and enjoyable for the children. On Thursday, Class 11 were lucky enough to have a session led by a Herts and Essex secondary science teacher. This was a child-led investigation, empowering the children to investigate a problem themselves, choosing their own variables and methods of measuring and recording.
