Safeguarding

In the interest of safeguarding families at Northgate and the wider community, local police officers will be monitoring parking outside school from time to time. They were present during pick up yesterday to observe the problems we are experiencing. Please allow extra time to park safely. Please remember parents do have access to a carpark at the Rugby Club and our crossing patrol person, Tony is there to ensure families are safe with the road crossing. Figures show that in 2021, 512 children aged seven or younger were killed or seriously injured on British roads. That's one young child every 17 hours – and the equivalent of a whole class of young children (27) every 19 days. Let us do all we can to protect our children!

Enriching the Curriculum

Mrs Fraser, one of our Governors is running a debating club for Year 5 and 6 on Wednesdays. This is designed to promote problem solving and innovative thinking skills.
