Each year there is a series of national tests which give parents the opportunity to see how your child's performance compares to other children nationally. It is very important that your child is in school at these times and in the weeks running up to the assessments so please do not book holidays etc.. around the test dates. Please avoid holidays and appointments in term time.

Y1 Phonics Week - 10th June - 14th 2024 (plus Y2 phonic catch ups) Y4 Times Tables Tests - 3rd June to 14th June 2024

In 2024, Key Stage 1 SATs are no longer compulsory national tests. The KS1 SATs have been 'replaced' by optional KS1 SATs tests. Children will continue to be assessed at the end of May, alongside children in other year groups to give parents an understanding of your child's attainment. Enriching the Curriculum

On Wednesday afternoon, Mrs Parrott came in with her colleague from ISG to support Year 5 with their geography topic 'time traveller' this half term. Year 5 are learning about how our local area has changed over time and writing balanced arguments on the benefits and disadvantages of building developments in Bishop's Stortford. It was great to learn about the different types of buildings designed by ISG and how the constructions benefit local communities. We learnt about the schools, hospitals, research labs and the new 'Sunset' studios being built in



Waltham Cross. It was interesting to hear about how developments are committed to supporting the environment with solar panels and special care taken to preserve biodiversity. Thank you so much for coming in Mrs Parrott! Written piece by Daniel Class 10

Also This morning Year 5 took part in a geography fieldtrip to Stortford Fields housing estate. In groups, we measured area currently being developed as the 'Western Neighbourhood Centre' which currently contains a care home but is going to provide services for the new community such as a doctor's surgery and a children's day nursery. We



sketched Hensman Close and labelled the different types of residential housing such as detached and terraced houses. After labelling land use on another map, we interviewed each other about what facilities we think there are and which facilities are missing. Lots of high quality map skills were used!

Safeguarding

The School pedestrian gate near to the school office will no longer be chained back before and after school. The gate is on a timer and will be open from 8.40am and 9.30am for drop off and 2.50pm and 5pm for pick up. Please just push the gate open and let it close behind you. Please remember to supervise younger children at all times in the playground as it is a very busy environment at drop off and pick up.

Playground equipment

Please do not allow your child to climb on the playground apparatus before or after school. Even if you are supervising your child, other children are then encouraged to play who may not be supervised. There have been accidents in the past and your co-operation with this is appreciated.

Please remind your children, including pre-schoolers, that they are not permitted to scoot or cycle on school premises. The entrance area is extremely busy in the morning and we do not wish to have any accidents. Thank you for your co-operation.
