Headteacher's News

What an interesting week we have had! On Tuesday lunchtime we had a fire alarm which everyone dealt with calmly and sensibly. If there had been a fire, we would have evacuated the site through the new gate on the field and headed up to the Rugby Club, who have kindly agreed to host us in this situation. This would get the children well away from the burning building, leave Cricketfield Lane clear for the emergency services and give parents suitable parking facilities.

Wednesday's challenge was the weather. We always try to keep the school open to enable learning and avoid inconvenience to parents, but also have to consider everyone's safety. So we changed the day somewhat, with the children watching a film over lunchtime before returning to afternoon lessons that were adapted for smaller class numbers, followed by some outdoor play, rather than assembly. Those children who were collected early prior to afternoon registration were marked absent—this is required for safeguarding reasons and clearly very important as we were reminded by the previous day's fire alarm. Teachers always record separately children who leave within a session. Parent consultations were unfortunately postponed but it enabled the staff—half of whom live outside Bishop's Stortford—to get home safely in the daylight. We look forward to seeing parents next Wednesday instead. Please don't forget to come early to look at your child's books. The school will close after the final appointment at 6pm.

The Northgate team proved how successfully they can work together in these unusual circumstances this week and I wish to thank all the staff for their extra efforts, including Mr Parker for keeping the site safe, those who helped grit the school grounds when Mr Parker's van broke down (and the parent who gave him a cup of tea while he was waiting for the AA!), and those who travelled from areas where there was significantly more snow than Bishop's Stortford.

We are hoping for warmer weather next Thursday so we can share our wonderful World Book Day costumes with you at our Playground Parade at the start of the day. In the meantime, I hope the children enjoy spending their World Book Day tokens which came home with them today.
