The session will explore how the shift from free play to smartphone-based childhood has contributed to rising levels of anxiety and other mental health challenges. Drawing on insights from the book, we'll look at the role of smartphones and play, share some of the initiatives we're introducing at school, and discuss practical ideas to help parents prevent some of the mental health challenges children are experiencing today.
