## **Headteacher's News**

I hope you received the school letter sent yesterday regarding the teachers' union strikes next week, stating that the school will be open as usual except Year 4. This week the leadership team and governors have reviewed the parental safeguarding questionnaire to identify any future actions. Of the families that replied (191/342 families), we were delighted that the majority of the responses were extremely positive, e.g. My child feels safe at school-94.1%, My child is happy at school—92.4%. The school premises are safe and well-resourced—96.6%. Many parents are clearly unsure how the school supports pupils to keep them safe. We provide parents with regular updates and links in our safeguarding section on the newsletter about how to keep your child safe when using the internet; we are now also trying to organise a parent session with an outside provider for the summer term, plus Miss Hartey is running a session for parents about what we teach regarding online safety on Safer internet day at 9am. Leaders are also considering adding PSHE and Computing into termly letters. If you have any further ideas that would support these, please email interact@northgate.herts.sch.uk. Thank you for your time completing the questionnaires.

We are always keen to enrich the curriculum for the pupils and are delighted that our Key Stage 2 children will be attending the Festival of literature at the College next week where they will listen to authors sharing their books and their stories about being a writer.

Year 1 has started their first topic 'Bright Lights, Big City'. This week they have been learning about the past and current royal family. Class 1 have made special invitations ready to send to the Queen Consort at Buckingham Palace for a 'Royal Tea Party' which will be held at school soon.

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As part of our Tremors topic, Year 3 made some 'volcanoes' using bicarbonate of soda, vinegar, washing up liquid and red powder paint. We mixed all the ingredients together apart from the vinegar and poured it into our volcano and then poured the vinegar in on top and watched our volcanos 'erupt.' It was very exciting and messy! We discussed which

two ingredients were key to the eruption and how they react when mixed together. Why don't you try it at home?



Year 4 are learning about electricity in science and this week we were investigating which circuits are complete and which are incomplete. We used batteries, bulbs and wires to test the different circuits to see if electricity would flow to light up the bulb.

## **Reminders and Updates**

#### **Traffic problems**

We are encouraging parents and carers to use the Ruby Club car park at the top of Cricketfield Lane for parking before school pickup and drop off. The club kindly agreed with Northgate some time ago that parents could use their facilities. As parking and congestion outside Northgate is always an issue we do hope you will use this if you can. It would be good to see an improvement outside school during these times for everyone's safety.

#### Lateness

We appreciate that traffic is a major issue at the moment so please leave earlier to ensure your child is not late. It is becoming increasingly regular that children are arriving into school via the office after the gate has closed in the morning. Please note the main gate and small pedestrian gate on Cricketfield Lane are open at 8.45am— 8.55am for children in Reception to Year 6. The start of the day is so important to settle the class and to complete sessions to reactivate learning so please ensure your child is on time each day. Medical Appointments

Please remember to keep your children off of school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness and/or diarrhoea. We cannot accept children who are known to have vomited or experienced diarrhoea in the past 48 hours. These viruses spread very quickly.
