# **Headteacher's News**

We hope that you found the Foundation Stage Meet the Teacher sessions informative. Next week will be starting a series of parent workshops starting with the Year 1 phonics session. This will explain how we teach phonics, using our scheme Little Wandle. It will explain how you can support your child's learning at home and helping the children get ready for the National Year 1 phonics screening in June. The PowerPoint from the session will be put onto our website.

Our current assembly value is responsibility and at Northgate, we value giving the children opportunities to be involved in many different roles across the school, helping them develop a variety of skills. Key roles in Year 6 are the House and Vice Captains, who carry out different jobs throughout the year and across the school. To appoint the House Captains, the staff voted based on who has consistently modelled the school code in terms of behaviour, attitude and work ethic. Plus the children also wrote and delivered a short speech to myself, highlighting their attributes and experience to make them a successful House Captain. I was so impressed with all the children—they all delivered their speeches with confidence, giving wonderful examples of how they had been an active member of the Northgate community and how they had developed their leadership and teamwork skills. It was a very close run competition with so many strong candidates. Winners can been seen with other leadership roles on the next page. Well done to everyone who took part! Children also voted for other leadership positions this week including the School Council, Eco Council and our Diversity, Inclusion and Well-being

# **Enriching the Curriculum**

Nursery have been talking about 'My Family' this week. The children made self portraits in coloured sand which meant they could practise many times refining their techniques.



On Thursday afternoon, Fletcher, Ollie and Ablie from Year 6, who are computer

monitors, helped Year 1 with their computing lesson. The children were learning how to use the

mouse/tack pad. They played puzzle games in which they had to move pieces into the right places to complete the image. The children found this tricky at first but were brilliant at it after a bit

of practise.

In Art, Year 2 are beginning to use light and dark strokes in order to create tone using sketching pencils. The children really enjoyed experimenting, pressing firmer and lighter with their pencils.

Science in Year 4 was exciting this week. The children completed a practical experiment based around gas and whether it has a weight. The children shook full bottles of fizzy water for a period of time to release carbon dioxide gas within the bottle. They then weighed the bottle recording the measurement. The lids were slowly loosened to allow the gas to escape out of the bottle and then they re-weighed

them. The conclusion was that gas does have a weight, as all the bottles weighed less after releasing the gas! Well done children!

In music, with Ms Cheung Year 6 were continuing their recorder lessons and getting to grips with notes B, A, G by playing Hot Cross Bun.



Some of our staff worked hard in their own time to tidy up the garden in the court yard. Bushes and plants needed cutting back and the patio
