Don't forget to download the free smartphone app as it is a very handy way of doing things. Go to your

phone's app store and search for School Gateway.

All outstanding items will be listed in the payments section. Once you have actioned an item it will disappear from the list. The items will also disappear after the date that they are due to be completed by, so please ensure that you complete them on time.

If you wish to see all the transactions you have completed, you need to log on to the School Gateway website and there is a tab at the top right called Payment History where you can see all your transactions made.

Medicines

If your child needs any medicine, please be advised that it must be in its original packaging, in date and, where relevant, have the pharmacy label attached. Children must not bring medicines to school in their bags or pockets, they need to be brought in by an adult and handed in/collected to/from the school office. An Administration of Medication form must be completed and handed in at the school office by the parent/carer. Forms can be obtained from the school office or can be found on the school website. Parents need to be aware of expiry dates and replace items such as inhalers and auto-injectors prior to expiry.

There will also be a plant stall, and visitors enjoy spring cheer from the Thaxted Morris dancers. The Gardens are open from 11.30am to 5pm, with last entry at 4pm. Entrance fee is £4.50 for adults and there's free entry for children under 16. Hot and cold drinks, bacon and cheese rolls and homemade cakes will be available; and there will also be a children's nature trail and craft activities.
