Headteacher's News

I hope parents found the EYFS 'Meet the Teacher' sessions and the coffee session with Mrs Wallace, our new SENCo, useful. We look forward to seeing you at the KS1. Lower KS2 and Upper KS2 reading sessions next week. Reading together is one of the easiest but most important ways in which you can help your child at home, and research show a focus on developing oral language skills is especially important for the development of a range of early reading and writing skills. Please encourage your child to talk about their book.

Both decoding and comprehension skills are necessary for confident and competent reading, but neither is sufficient on its own. Fluent reading supports comprehension because pupils' are freed from focusing on word recognition and can be redirected towards comprehending the text. As well as listening to your child read, it is beneficial if you show fluent reading by regularly reading to them.

Children need a range of wider language and literacy experiences to develop their understanding of written texts in all their forms. Therefore try to encourage your child to read different genres of texts and a wide range of content topics.

Reminders and Updates

Applying for Free School Meals

Every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 is eligible for free school meals, but did you know that Hertfordshire CC could save you money on school meals for children in Years 3 to 6 if you are in receipt of certain benefits such as Income Support, Child Tax Credits, Working Tax Credit or Universal Credit. You may be eligible for funding towards reduced music lesson fees, free school milk etc. The school will also receive funding to help towards covering the cost of any extra support your child may need. Pick Up

If your child is being collected by someone who doesn't normally pick them up, please could you send a note in with your child to inform the class teacher. Where this is the case, the school office does not need to be notified.
