Enriching the curriculum

This morning, Year 4 experienced life in a Viking village. Everyone wore amazing costumes and the children mastered lots of different crafts, allowing items to be traded with other tribes. This included: making clay moulds for metal castings; designing necklaces with the image of their God Thor; weaving their own fabric which would be used for clothing or as boat sails; making ink by crushing charcoal in a pestle and mortar and mixing with tree sap and water; producing warrior bracelets and illuminating letters for manuscripts using decorative designs which featured animals and mythical creatures. The children also visited the wise woman who was always right! She would treat illness with smelling potions made from herbs and spices, even used bones (both animal and human). She would poke the bodies of ill people to detect soreness and listen to their heart and lungs. A narrative was followed during the day and eventually the Vikings had a battle against the Saxons using swords and shields. The children chose the result of the battle, the Vikings were defeated and slain by the Saxons. The Vikings believed that in the next life they would feast eternally in glorious Valhalla (heaven). The children immersed themselves in this interactive activity. Later in the day, the group were transported back to the present day and became archaeologists uncovering the Viking village of the past. Safeguarding

Families First is the term used in Hertfordshire for services that work together to support families who need extra help.

We all experience difficulties at some point. Families First can help you find early help and information to prevent issues from getting worse.

Families First will work with you and your family to create a package of support. The service is available to all Hertfordshire families with children under 18 (25 if they have a learning need or disability).

Issues they can help with are: Parenting, mental and physical health problems, drug or alcohol dependency, domestic abuse, school related concerns – such as your child is not attending school, debt problems and risk of becoming homeless.

Parenting advice offered: Childcare, advice. Courses for parents: Staying healthy, Emotional and Mental Health, Relationship Support, Private Fostering, Keeping Children Safe Online, Domestic Abuse, Money Advice, Carers and Services for Young People.

Reminders and Notices

Lateness

Please ensure you leave enough time in the morning to get your child to school in time for registration at 8.45am. Lateness is very disrupting for the teacher and class, but if you do have a valid reason for being late please call the school office in advance and we will inform the teacher.

School Library Books

Please remember to check at home for any school books, as these must be returned to their class. Thank you.

Temperatures

Although unpredictable at times, the weather seems to be improving! On hot days please ensure that a high SPF sun cream is applied to your child before school and they must remember sun hats and water bottles. Children must also have a raincoat for days that maybe wet.

Uniform

Skirts, dresses and trousers must be smart school wear. Children in Year 5 and 6 are expected to wear a shirt and tie. Ties are optional in Lower Key Stage 2. Smart black shoes should be worn, without flashing lights (or with the lights turned off). Children are not allowed to wear sandals, trainers or boots. Children are not allowed to wear earrings or other jewellery or smart watches in school. Hair accessories must be in school colours, yellow (until end of July) or bottle green. During PE lessons all children should wear bottle green shorts/green tracksuit bottoms with their white t-shirts. No extreme hairstyles, such as tramlines are allowed at school.
