This week was **Race Equality Week 2026**, and all children took part in an assembly focused on race equality. They explored what makes us who we are, including physical features such as skin colour and hair texture, as well as culture, history, religion and language.

We also talked about standing up to discrimination and being an "ally", encouraging children to think about how they could speak up and support others. Pick Up/Drop Off: Parking Considerately

We have again been contacted by **several local residents** regarding parents parking inconsiderately when dropping off and collecting children. Please be mindful of our neighbours as they are getting extremely frustrated.

Please do not: block driveways, park on grass verges, or restrict access to the road, which must remain clear for emergency vehicles.

Where possible, please park at the Rugby Club and walk to school. This helps keep the area safer, provides fresh air and exercise, and is a pleasant, sociable way to start the day. Tony, our crossing patrol officer, is on hand to help keep everyone safe.

Safeguarding:

Dangerous parking increases the risk to children and parents. Yellow zigzag lines outside school mean stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited during school hours, in line with the Highway Code.

Government figures show that around 1,000 children are injured each month on roads near schools.

The staff car park must not be used for morning drop-offs. If access is required for an exceptional reason, please contact the school office in advance.

Enriching the Curriculum

On Monday, **Year 2** took part in a DT project, constructing moving vehicles from recycled materials linked to their science topic on construction and vehicles. The children planned their designs and used tools, including junior hacksaws and PVA glue, to cut, shape, and stick their models. They could choose to make their vehicles move using pegs or straws and finished by painting their creations.

The children produced some brilliant models — true engineers of the future! A big thank you to the parent helpers who volunteered; we couldn't have done it without you.



This week, **Reception** children made rainbow toast — a fun, creative, and edible activity using milk mixed with food colouring painted onto white bread. They created vibrant designs before the bread was toasted, setting the colours and turning it into a colourful snack.

This activity helped develop fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, creativity, and colour recognition, while also encouraging sensory exploration, listening and following instructions, independence, and confidence. The children really enjoyed this experience.

World Book Day Thursday 5th March 2026

On World Book Day, as part of our celebrations, we are welcoming the children to come to school dressed as an adjective. For example: *athletic* – sports kit, *sparkly* – a sequin item of clothing, *fantastical* – a royal outfit, etc. We are encouraging children to be as creative and adventurous as possible with their adjective choice. If your child already has a fancy-dress outfit, you can work together to find a suitable adjective to match it. Weather permitting, we will be hosting our annual World Book Day parade on the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds at approximately 8:55am.
