## Coronavirus

We are continuing to monitor the situation regarding Coronavirus very carefully. The latest advice is to stay at home for 7 days if you have either:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough

In school we have spoken to the children regularly about the importance of handwashing to reduce the spread of germs. We have also closed off the water fountains until the virus is contained. Please ensure that your child has a small, named water bottle in class each day during this period.

If the Government instruct schools to close, guidance relating to learning from home will be provided for each year group. Please contact the school office if you are unable to access eschools.

## Safeguarding

If your child needs any medicine please be advised that it must be in its original packaging, in date and, where relevant, have the pharmacy label attached. Children must not bring medicines to school in their bags or pockets, they need to be brought in by an adult and handed in and collected to and from the school office.

An Administration of Medication form must be completed and handed in at the school office by the parent/carers. Forms can be obtained from the School Office or can be found on the school website. Parents need to be aware of expiry dates and replace items such as inhalers and auto-injectors prior to expiry. We appreciate your support in this matter.
