Safeguarding - eSafety

ParentZone have just released a handout regarding a new YouTube trend called 'Strip Fortnite' which we would like to make you aware of.

What is 'Strip Fortnite'?

Fortnite is currently one of the most popular online games out there and receives a lot of its publicity through videos posted on YouTube of influencers playing the game. A 'Strip Fortnite' video generally shows a young male playing Fortnite, while a female companion removes items of clothing every time he makes a 'kill'.

Can my child access it?

Videos on YouTube generally do not have an age rating and can be accessed without the need to sign in.

What are the risks?

It seems to be something created with the aim to encourage visitors to click on a link in the video to visit another website. Some of these could be links to adult sites that host pornographic content.

What can I do?

- Make sure that you have applied the parental controls to your broadband and devices to prevent pornographic content.
- Encourage younger children to use the YouTube Kids app.
- Talk to your child about what is OK to watch and what isn't. Children may not be actively looking for this content but click on it out of curiosity because they are not aware that the content is inappropriate. The full handout with more details is attached to this newsletter.

Safeguarding

Hertfordshire Safeguarding Children Board

In the run up to Christmas, it's especially important to be aware of toys and devices that use button batteries (the flat disc-like silver batteries) and to make sure we keep children safe by using, storing and disposing of them properly.

It's extremely dangerous to swallow button batteries or to insert them into noses or ears where they can still create a circuit and cause harm.

Button batteries are in far more products that you might initially think, including car key fobs, musical cards and books as well as toys that are powered and household electrical items, such as a thermometer.

Always make sure that button batteries are securely stored out of sight and reach of children. When they are no longer powering items, dispose of them safely and do not leave them laying around – they can still harm children if swallowed, even if the product they power needs new ones.

Reception Christmas Activity Day

On Tuesday, the children had a wonderful Christmas Activity Day where they were immersed in lots of creative activities. They made hot chocolate reindeers, Christmas Pops, as well as using lots of glitter, glue and sparkly sequins to create Christmas trees and stained glass windows. Rhodes Support Group

You may be aware that we have organised a petition to Bishop's Stortford Town Council calling on them to continue to support the Rhodes Arts Complex in South Road by means of an annual grant, whatever the outcome of the proposed new arts venue in Old River Lane. The grant currently supports both the town's Museum and the wide range of arts and community activities which take place at Rhodes. The Town Council have agreed in principle to contribute to the on-going costs of the proposed new venue and we are concerned that they may withdraw or substantially reduce their support of Rhodes. Without it, the Trustees will find it very difficult, if not impossible, to run a viable business for the benefit of the town. We appreciate that Bishop's Stortford is growing and does need a wider range of facilities for its residents, but we do not wish the growth to be to the detriment of Rhodes nor to let the money that has already been invested in the venue go to waste.

The petition, which already has over 1,000 signatures on paper, is also on line until the New Year at <https://you.38degrees.org.uk/petitions/retain-rhodes-arts-complex-bishop-s-stortford> which, in addition, gives a more detailed account of the background to our campaign.

Please note that we are an independent group, not part of the Rhodes Birthplace Trust or the Rhodes Arts Complex management.
