On Tuesday morning we started with our house parachute challenge, where the children enjoyed the opportunity to work with children in other years. Each class has completed a class investigation, with a focus on presenting their results. Many year groups have had the opportunity to use our pond to go pond dipping. Enriching the curriculum - Science Week

On Monday Year 1—5 took part in a science related house activity as part of our Science Week activities. The children explored and investigated designing a parachute. This encouraged them to consider why a parachute slows down the descent and discuss how the forces of gravity and the air resistance affect the parachute. They had so much fun using different materials and sizes to see what worked best







Fab Science came into school for three days this week to provide workshops for our R-Y5 pupils aimed at boosting science learning through practical, hands on experimenting and inspirational demonstrations. The children learned about forces and Bernoulli's principle (how gases and fluids behave.)
