What is a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)?

Each school must have appropriate senior members of staff to take lead responsibility for child protection. Key aspects of the 'Designated Safeguarding Lead' role include:

Making sure all staff are aware how to raise safeguarding concerns, ensuring all staff understand the symptoms of child abuse and neglect, referring any concerns to social care, monitoring children who are the subject of child protection plans, maintaining accurate and secure child protection records, raising awareness of the school's safeguarding policies and procedures, and ensuring they are implemented and reviewed regularly.

At Northgate the DSLs are Mrs Tanner, Mrs Clynes, Mrs Layer, Mrs Wallace and Mrs Shepherd.
