We have been asked by the PSCO team at Bishop's Stortford Police Station to inform our parents and carers that they have received numerous concerns relating to parking at drop-off and pick-up times and the safety issues caused by dangerous parking/driving in the streets surrounding the site.

They are working with the same aim as we are at Northgate, keeping children safe, however recent reports have suggested that this is at risk and so measures need to be taken.

The PSCO team will be patrolling regularly in an effort to combat this and will issue fixed penalty notices should issues continue.

We hope this will go some way to helping improve the situation and would ask you to make the safety of our children your upper most consideration when driving and parking outside school.

The children discussed how we could combat this and came up with their own ideas, such as getting the bins emptied more regularly, reminding their classes to pick up their snack rubbish, completing daily litter picking duties in their zones



and taking out a class temporary basket/ box for the zoned field to put their snack rubbish in, before emptying it at the end of playtime.

## **Test and Trace Payments**

The Department for Education has announced that parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria (which includes receipt of certain low-income benefits).

The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme, which is administered by district and borough councils in Hertfordshire (and ends on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> June) ensures that parents receive some financial support if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities and are unable to work from home. ## **School Uniform**

For health and safety reasons, no jewellery is permitted in school, including stud earrings, and fashion accessories such as nail varnish, hair braids and hair gel/cream are not allowed.

Long hair must be tied back and hair slides/ties must be in school colours. No extreme hair styles, e.g. shaved tramlines.

Black shoes (not boots). Shoes need to be comfortable, with sensible heels to avoid accidents. No fashion footwear, light up shoes or trainers please. As shops have reopened, we expect that all children will now come to school in the correct shoes. If your child is unable to wear the correct shoes to school, please ensure an explanatory letter is sent in to your child's class. Thank you for your co-operation.
