# **Headteacher's News**

The children continue to adjust and regain skills that they did not apply for many weeks during lockdown. Children are learning to deal once again with interacting with a range of people in the classroom and outside. Today in assembly I reminded the children about appropriate behaviour at lunchtime as they learn to play in larger groups within their year group bubbles. Please encourage your child to always talk to an adult if there has been a problem so we can deal with it straight away.

All year groups in key stage 1 and key stage 2 now have some catch up sessions with an additional teacher so all children benefit at some point throughout the week, either working with the additional teacher or their class teacher, in a smaller class. The teachers are continuing to work hard to reactive children's learning and fill in gaps.

To help you understand the work your child is covering, each year group's termly letter will be sent out shortly.

This week, as part of a regular safeguarding review, the leadership team have been updating the fire evacuation policy. We wish to remind parents that if you are on site and the fire alarm goes off, parents need to go to the gazebo between the key stage 1 and key stage 2 playground. If there was a fire at school that required a full evacuation of the site, the children would be taken to the rugby club. Parents would then be contacted through School Gateway to collect their children from there.

## Safeguarding Morning Drop off Arrangements

### Change to Gate Closing Time

With effect from Monday 10th May, we will be closing the gates at 9am each morning.

We are confident that social distancing measures can be adhered to within this time and we wish to reduce the disruption to the morning routines of the classroom.

Children who arrive in school after 9am should enter via the school office and will be marked late.

It is also important to remember that, with the exception of Nursery and Year 5, children must not be dropped off at school before 8.45am. The teachers use this time to prepare their day and therefore the classrooms are often unsupervised before this time.

Until there is a change in government guidance, it remains important that we keep to the staggered drop off times and to continue to wear masks on site to ensure the safety of the children.

## **Reminders and Updates**

#### **Absence - Sickness and Diarrhoea**

## School Governors Needed

We regularly review the make-up of the school's governing body to ensure that we have as wide a range of experience and expertise as possible to support the school and its senior leadership team.

Governors are responsible

for overseeing the management side of a school: strategy, policy, budgeting and staffing. They enable the school to run as effectively as possible, working alongside



senior leaders and supporting teachers to provide excellent education to children. Being a school governor involves a commitment to attending governing body meetings - six full governing body and six committee meetings a year (please note, sub-committee meetings often take place during the school day). The committees consider issues such as setting the school vision, mitigating financial risk and scrutinising educational outcomes. Governors visit the school to understand the way the school runs, but also at times be involved in specific projects or discuss specific issues. They also need to be prepared to complete relevant training. They are actively involved in the school community, acting as critical friends to the Headteacher and senior leaders.

We are seeking new governors, ideally with either a legal background who could act as a legal sounding board for the senior leadership team and governing body, as well as fulfilling the general role of a governor, or with HR/ recruitment experience to sit on the HR committee. However, if you do not have a background in these areas, we would welcome expressions of interest from a parent or anyone from the community who would like to give back.
