Headteacher's News

We are now able to share with you the recent Ofsted report. We are pleased with the overall outcome of good with outstanding aspects, particularly the recognition of school's exceptional work in developing children's behaviour and supporting their personal development.

As you will see, the report highlights many strengths and positives of which we are extremely proud, including:

- Pupils have a thirst for learning.
- They work hard and achieve well, particularly in reading and mathematics.
- Pupils have **extremely positive attitudes** to school life. There is **a strong culture of respect** throughout the school.
- Leaders have high expectations and are tenacious in their drive for school improvement.

Other highlights that were mentioned to leaders by the inspectors but were not in the report are in the attached letter.

Every inspection results in areas that are identified for improvement and at Northgate we received one, which is to continue to work on areas identified in our current school development plan (history and art).

The change in grading from the 2008 inspection does not reflect a decline in standards but the rises in expectations of Ofsted inspections since 2008, where the main focus was on attainment in English and maths and now is the whole curriculum.

I would like to finish by saying how incredibly proud we are of all our children and staff and that, as a team, we will continue to be resolute with commitment to the highest quality of education, care and opportunity for every child at Northgate.

Linked with their Tremors project Class 5 & 6 are studying Pompeii. They are


writing their own stories in English, made models of the earth's core and in
