The Keeping Children Safe in Education 2021 update contains a wealth of information available to support parents and carers to keep children safe online. The following list should provide a useful starting point:

<u>Childnet</u> offers a toolkit to support parents and carers of children of any age to start discussions about their online life, to set boundaries around online behaviour and technology use, and to find out where to get more help and support

<u>Commonsensemedia</u> provide independent reviews, age ratings, & other information about all types of media for children and their parents

Government advice about protecting children from specific online harms such as child sexual abuse, sexting, and cyberbullying Internet Matters provide age-specific online safety checklists, guides on how to set parental controls on a range of devices, and a host of practical tips to help children get the most out of their digital world 152

<u>London Grid for Learning</u> provides support for parents and carers to keep their children safe online, including tips to keep primary aged children safe online

Net-aware provides support for parents and carers from the

NSPCC and O2, including a guide to social networks, apps and games

Parentzone provides help for parents and carers on how to keep their children safe online

<u>UK Safer Internet Centre</u> provide tips, advice, guides and other resources to help keep children safe online.

# **Secondary Transfer 2022**

Year 6 Please be aware that the deadline for applications is fast approaching. Parents will need to make an application online or on paper by 31st October 2021. The Admissions Team have recommended that parents complete their application by 25<sup>th</sup> October so that if there are any queries they can be dealt with by the Admissions Team ahead of the deadline.

#### **Covid Guidance**

<u>Masks</u> In order to protect our whole school community, we would request that parents continue to wear masks while you are on school grounds. Thank you for your support.

<u>Positive Cases</u> At present, the government guidance is for children showing symptoms of Covid to be kept at home and to take a PCR test.

If your child tests positive for Covid they will need to self-isolate for a 10 day period in accordance with the current guidance. Currently, there is no longer a requirement for close contacts (aged 11 and under or those who are fully vaccinated) of a positive case to isolate for this period however updated guidance will be sent out should the situation arise.
