## Enriching the Curriculum - Wellbeing

Over the last two weeks, Year 5 were lucky enough to take part in an Anti-Bullying Workshop. The children reflected on how bullying made them feel, through a variety of scenarios that were given to them. Grace (C10) said, 'It made me think about other people's feelings'. The children also acted as 'bullies' through scripts. Alfie (C9) said, 'It was good fun and I learnt how to show respect by using different scripted scenarios'. It really opened the children's eyes to how comments can be seen by others. At the end of the session the children were given the chance to perform. Harry (C9) and Eshaal (C10) said, 'The experience was exquisitely exciting, I really enjoyed learning what bullying was through acting'. The session was very beneficial to all of the children as it allowed them to learn strategies to use if they were ever put in an uncomfortable situation and who they could speak to.

All children in years Reception to Year 6 are the responsibility of their parents until 8.45am and must be supervised until they are through the gates when they are opened **at 8.45am**. It is vitally important that the children are not left alone.

## Fundraising - Christmas Jumper Day



Next Friday 10th December is our Northgate Christmas Jumper/Elf Yourself Day!

This year we will be supporting both the Save the Children's 'Christmas Jumper Day' and Isabel Hospice's 'Elf Yourself' appeal.

Pupils and staff can choose to wear a Christmas jumper or anything red, green or elf-themed.

We will be suggesting a donation of £1.00 which will be collected in class on the day and look forward to seeing both staff and children in their festive wear next Friday.



### Free School Meals

Your child could get free school meals, worth over £450 per child per year, and they might be able to gain extra support such as some financial support with trips and access to our pupil premium homework club, if you receive any of the following:

- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits you get).

If you receive any of these benefits, the application only takes 5 minutes to complete and in most cases we can tell you straightaway if your child can get [free meals at school](#).

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until March 2023, or until they finish their current phase of schooling (primary or secondary), if that's after the end of March 2023. Have your National Insurance number or Home Office number to hand when you apply. Don't miss out, apply now!

You can apply for other benefits that you may qualify for at the same time.
