Year 3 had fun with a rhythm composing activity on Thursday. Rhythmic patterns are built from elements and the intervals between them, and just as our ear will follow along

with the rhythm of a song, our eyes will follow rhythm created visually and playing chase the squirrel. One student was the "Dog" ("It"). The rest of the class was divided in to Trees and Squirrels. While the song is sung, the Trees stand still, the Squirrels and the Dog walk around. At the end of the song, the Dog tries to tap as many Squirrels as possible. The Squirrels can be safe if they curl up under Trees. They also had fun in Science learning about the human skeleton. They had to label



their bodies with the names of different bones.
