# Important Information – Spy Dog/Spy Cats/Spy Pup Books

Puffin, the children's publisher, has issued an alert about books by Andy Cope, including the *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat*, and *Spy Pup* series.

These books contain a weblink intended to direct children to Mr Cope's website. However, the domain is no longer owned by him and now leads to a third-party site containing **inappropriate** and **pornographic** content.

We have checked our school library and classrooms to ensure none of these books are present.

Please check any copies at home, and remind children to always speak to an adult before following any links in the books they read.

### **Individual Photos**

Individual photos will be taken on Wednesday, 15th

**October**. Please ensure that your child is dressed in full school uniform. If your child has PE on Wednesdays, they should come to school wearing their full uniform and bring their PE kit in a bag, ready to change into.

We have noticed that some children are wearing hoodies instead of school jumpers or cardigans. Please note that hoodies should only be worn on PE days.

# **The Importance of Tying Up Hair**

If your child's hair is below shoulder length, it should be tied up at school to help reduce the spread of head lice (nits), which are common in school settings.

Tying up long hair also keeps it neat and out of the face, helping children focus better.

Please ensure your child's hair is tied back, especially during term time when outbreaks are more likely.


