I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff and pupils who have made me feel so welcome – it has been great to join the Northgate community.

In the first part of the term we were creative and made body percussion compositions in the style of Stomp. Then the different year groups studied and performed music in different styles – Year 3 focussed on Reggae, Year 4 soul, Year 5 the music of WW2 and Year 6 rap music.

We are now full steam ahead for Christmas in preparation for the carol service at the end of term and also to have fun singing special songs that you can't sing at any other time of the year! At the carol service, each KS2 year group will be performing their own song and, as we want pupils to sing from memory, we will soon be sending words home to learn. Please be aware that how the carol service is presented this year will depend on Covid numbers at the time.

The choir is also busy practising for the carol service and we have just started a recorder group who we hope will be ready to perform soon.

We have lots of musical children at Northgate and are lucky to have our lovely piano teacher, Mr Thomson.
