Safeguarding - School Parking

The tennis club have made the decision to use ParkingEye to manage their car park and envisage it will be in place by the start of the next school year, which may result in £100 fines. The Sports Trust will also keep their gates closed to the bottom car park for the foreseeable future.

ParkingEye are an external company and will not be lenient with fines. Parking in front of the gates will also result in a fine as it is part of their land and the camera will be set up accordingly.

We have also received a complaint from a resident of Grailands as driveways are being blocked, cars are being driven along and are parking on pavements and cars are sitting with their engines on. This is not only illegal but it raises serious health issues for residents and our children.
