# **Headteacher's News**

With the government announcement on Monday night, we will now have to change some of our end of term arrangements. We are sadly unable to invite parents to our Sports' Day or the instrumental concerts.

We are currently finalising details and awaiting further advice from County for the Year 6 events and further details will follow.

In all primary schools it is now compulsory to teach relationships education. Our policy for relationships, health and sex education is on our website, setting out how we approach the subject.

The focus of relationships education in primary school is on teaching the fundamental building blocks and characteristics of positive relationships, with particular reference to friendships and family relationships. Relationships education should support in helping to foster pupil wellbeing and develop resilience and character that we know are fundamental to pupils being happy, successful and productive members of society. From Nursery through to Year 6, pupils are taught how to take turns, how to treat each other with kindness, consideration and respect, the importance of honesty and truthfulness, permission seeking and giving, and the concept of personal privacy. Establishing personal space and boundaries, showing respect and understanding the differences between appropriate and inappropriate, or unsafe physical and other contact, are all part of children's learning. Some aspects are linked with RE and children reflect on family relationships, different family groups and friendship.

Health education teaches pupils about physical health and mental wellbeing, focusing on recognising the link between the two and being able to make healthy lifestyle choices. In our increasingly complex world, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way. Health education also creates an opportunity to enable pupils to be taught about positive emotional and mental wellbeing. This is also linked to PE.

The teaching of sex education is linked to the knowledge of the human life cycle set out in the national curriculum for science. It teaches children how human reproduction occurs, including how a baby is conceived and born. Our sex education programme is tailored to the age and the physical and emotional maturity of the pupils. Parents and carers have the right to withdraw pupils from sex education but not from relationships or health education.
