Topic

Home Learning

Home learning in Year 5 is given out on a Friday and expected back on a Wednesday. We will also put the homework on e-schools each Friday. Please write comments in your child's home learning book if they need help or found something difficult.

Children will receive two pieces of home learning on a weekly basis consisting of an English and a maths task. Children should spend no longer than 30 minutes on each task. Alongside this, spellings will be set weekly. These activities are an integral part of your child's education and key in their academic progress. Home Learning tasks must be completed each week.

Please ensure times tables are practised regularly, to support children in their weekly times tables tests.

Maths

This year, children will be working with numbers up to 1,000,000. They will continue learning formal written methods alongside mental strategies.



We will do weekly arithmetic practise, as well as problem solving and reasoning activities.

Children are expected to fluently recall times tables facts up to 12×12 . If you would like any more information, please come and speak to us.

Reading

In class, we will be reading a range of texts, including 'Goodnight Mister Tom' and 'The Lion and the Unicorn' which are linked to this term's topics.

All children have a reading record book which they are expected to take home and bring into school daily. Teachers will check record books in your child's weekly guided reading session. Children may use school library books or bring in an age appropriate book from home. Please listen to your child read at least three times per week for 15 minutes, in order to help them increase their vocabulary and deepen their understanding of the text. If your child has lost or misplaced their reading record, please let us know as soon as possible.
