The local fire brigade came to see EYFS on Monday morning. They showed the children one of their fire engines and all the equipment they keep on board. The firefighters explained how the hoses and ladders work and the children got to see the 'Jaws of life', a hydraulic rescue tool

> used by first responders to help save lives. One of the parents, Mr Hay, who is a firefighter, spoke to the children in the classroom about fire safety. The children really enjoyed this experience and have been dressing up all week. The children

## Visibility on dark nights

During the winter when the dark evenings are with us so early, it is vitally important for the children to understand that they need to Be Bright to Be Seen.

Think about what your child is wearing? School uniform and coats maybe dark and children are safer if they are visible. You can easily add high-visibility reflective strips on their clothing, school bags or bike helmets. Additionally, they could carry a torch.

## No Dogs Policy

Dogs are <u>not</u> permitted on the school grounds at anytime, this means during school hours or after school hours (excluding assistance dogs). Dogs can behave unpredictably when placed in an unfamiliar, busy, noisy and crowded school environment and that this can lead to unexpected behaviour in even the best-behaved pet. Some children may have allergies and there is always the potential of fouling. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter, thank you. We have the Dogs Trust coming into school 28th and 29th November to teach the children about safety around dogs.

He is a qualified jungle service instructor and a free fall parachutist. The children were so interested in what he had to say and we thanked him so much for coming to Northgate.
