Enriching the Curriculum

Year 3 - Celtic Harmony Camp

On the 6th July, Year 3 went back to prehistoric times and spent the day as Neolithic hunter-gathers. They were shown how to make fire using a bow drill, were taken into the woods to forage for food as our ancestors would have done. Later on, the classes were taught how to use flint knapping to create stone axes and arrow heads. Then, using their practice spears, the children went on a hunt to kill a mammoth! After lunch, the classes built temporary shelters and told a story from times past. The classes were praised for their good behaviour and their general knowledge of the stone age.
