Headteacher's News

Well done to our Year 6 children, who completed their National SATs tests this week! As always, they worked incredibly hard and we're very proud of their positive attitude throughout. A big thank you to the staff who provided breakfasts each morning-this made a great start to the day for everyone involved.

This week, we were made aware of an incident involving children posting completely inappropriate content on social media, with some parents unaware it was happening. We understand how challenging it can be to navigate the world of social media as a parent, but it's essential to remind children that their safety is a priorityand that includes online. Please ensure your child understands that you may check their mobile devices to help keep them safe. To support parents in this area, we've arranged an information session led by our IT partner, Eduthing. This session is especially aimed at parents of children in Upper Key Stage 2, though all parents are welcome to attend. The session will be on Wednesday, 16th July at 8.50—9.20am before the challenge session and the work sharing for upper KS2. See attached poster. If the session proves useful, we'll look into running a similar one next term.

Enriching the curriculum

Year 3 performed their first instrumental concert for parents and carers yesterday. The children entertained the audience with a scarf dance and a body percussive piece, then some individual children performed solo pieces . Well done children; you were all fabulous!

Year 6 have spent time over the last few weeks learning about creating great adverts. The School's Business Manager, Ms Morris, tried to bring an element of realism to their learning by explaining the importance of good advertising. The session explored the fundamentals of effective marketing and the art of creating compelling adverts. The focus was on what makes a good advert compared with a bad one, and key strategies to ensure adverts capture attention, engage the audience, and deliver clear messages.

Year 6 were asked to think about how this would relate to Northgate and what messages we could share about life at our school – why would children want to join us, and why would parents want to send their children here? The children were then challenged to create their own advert, applying these principles, and were offered the opportunity for their advert to be included in some of our marketing materials, including our welcome brochure or by being showcased at the upcoming new parents' open evening in June.

Social Media and Children: What Parents Need to Know Children and young people use a wide range of social media apps and websites. Popular platforms include Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, and Discord. Although the minimum age to use these platforms is 13, many children are introduced to them at a younger age.

Social media can offer positive experiences. It allows children to stay connected with friends and family, and gives them access to learning videos and gaming tutorials. However, there are also potential downsides. It's important for parents and carers to be aware of the risks and support their children in using social media safely. Enriching the Curriculum

The children in Ducklings will be exploring different foods as part of their "Food Enrichment" topic in the next few weeks. The aim is to encourage them to try new things and develop a love for a variety of tastes and textures. It will be a great opportunity for them to learn about new flavours and talk about the foods they like and dislike.

As part of their science topic "Animals including humans" Year 4 have been learning all about the digestive system and how our body breaks down food. To help the students better understand this fascinating process, they conducted a hands-on experiment that visually demonstrated how food moves through the intestines. The children used tights to represent the intestines. They placed mashed banana, biscuit and orange inside the tights and gently squeezed them through, simulating how food travels and gets digested in our stomach and intestines. It was a fantastic way to bring our studies of the human body to life!
