Enriching the Curriculum - Music Lessons

Instrumental Music Lessons

At this time of year, we would usually have visits from Music For Schools Foundation, a charity which aims to



make music lessons more accessible and affordable for families. The instruments offered are: clarinet, flute, cornet (from Year 3), trumpet and alto saxophone (from Year 5). An instrument package is offered in order to enable younger

children to use a suitable instrument for their size and physical capabilities, for example a mini-clarinet and curved head flute.

Lessons can be individual or small group, depending on uptake and usually take place at the end of the school day. If your child is in Year 2 or above and you would like to book instrumental lessons for next academic year, further information is available at mfsf.org.uk. MFSF's mission is to make music accessible to all, and therefore offer a number of children lessons at a reduced rate, according to eligibility criteria; please contact them for more information.

Instrumental lessons for a wider range of instruments and opportunities to play in ensembles for instrumentalists of different standards are also available from the Hertfordshire Music Service, taking place at Birchwood High School. Further information can be found at Herts Music Service
