#### **Headteacher's News**

A huge congratulations to all our Year 6 children who did extremely well in their end of Key Stage assessments. We had 90% achieve age related expectation (ARE) in maths and 83% achieving ARE in reading. This fantastic result is a reflection of the hard work and positive learning attitude Year 6 have shown throughout the year. We are extremely proud of them all, particularly with the last 2 years of disrupted education.

International Week has been a great success this week with the children increasing their geographical understanding of countries of the Commonwealth. There has also been emphasis on gaining an understanding of diversity in sport through our seated volleyball house event. Thanks to the staff for organising the event.
