Headteacher's News

A huge thank you to Bishop's Stortford College for welcoming Northgate children to their **Literature Festival** this week. On Monday, Year 1 and 2 enjoyed a sensory performance of The Flying Trunk by Last Unicorn Airways. On Thursday, some Year 3 and 4 pupils were entertained by author Jack Meggitt-Phillips, who spoke about his popular 'The Beast and the Bethany' series. The festival concluded on Friday with Year 6 listening to award winning Nathanael Lessore, who shared stories inspired by his South East London childhood. We hope these sessions inspired and further developed the children's enthusiasm for reading.

Reading plays a vital role in success at school and beyond, so please continue to support your children's reading over the holidays. This does not have to be limited to books – subtitles on favourite programmes, reading signs on days out, museum guides, comics, magazines, emails, blogs and audiobooks all help to develop strong reading skills.

Thank you to Mr Brown and Mr Sainsbury for organising our **Independent Enquirer Elephant Day**, which the children thoroughly enjoyed. The activities helped to develop key skills and reinforced the message that working independently can sometimes feel challenging – and that this is completely normal.

You can support your child's independence at home by establishing simple routines, offering choices, and giving small responsibilities. Encouraging them to pack their own bag, help prepare lunch, and manage morning and bedtime routines will build confidence and organisational skills.

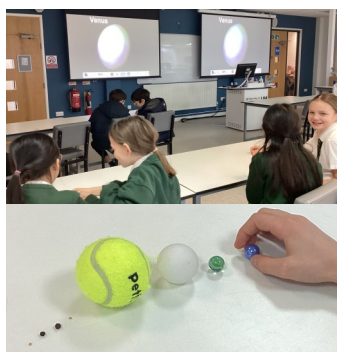

Enriching the curriculum

On Wednesday 11th February, **Year 5** visited Bayfordbury Observatory. This experience was an exciting way to learn about space beyond the classroom. It included an interactive talk on the solar system, a planetarium show, and a tour of the telescopes, with the oldest one dating back to 1970.

Unfortunately, the telescopes could not be used due to the damp weather. However, the children had the opportunity to turn the telescopes and focus them on a particular planet or constellation. The children also used a variety of spherical objects, ranging from a tennis ball to a peppercorn and a sesame seed, to help visualise the differences in the sizes of the planets.

Enriching the Curriculum

Today, Northgate pupils took part in **Independent Enquirer Elephant Day**, focusing on developing independence, resilience, and problem-solving skills.

In the morning, children worked in mixed classes across their key stages to explore what it means to be an independent learner. They completed a range of mini challenges, including a productive failure task using money bags, organising and prioritising their morning routines, event planning, improving a butterfly drawing through evaluation. Nursery built a marble run bridge and raced Chinese New Year-themed boats by blowing them across water.



These activities promoted teamwork, communication, and perseverance, and it was wonderful to see pupils supporting one another and stepping outside their comfort zones.

In the afternoon, children returned to their own classes to apply their new skills to an in-class challenge, showing great creativity and determination throughout the day.

We are incredibly proud of how our pupils embraced the challenges and demonstrated the qualities of confident, independent learners.

This week, we celebrated **Safer Internet Day 2026** in school. The theme was *"Smart tech, safe choices – Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI."*

In assembly, Mrs Adams, our computing lead, talked about what AI is and where children might see it, such as voice assistants, video recommendations, games and chatbots. We discussed how AI can be helpful for learning and creativity, but also why it is important to use it safely.

The children learned that not everything online is always true, and that AI can sometimes be used in unkind or unsafe ways. We reminded everyone to keep personal information private and to tell a trusted adult if something online makes them feel worried or uncomfortable.

Year 6 have been combining their science work on electricity, their computing work on coding, and their DT skills to create fairground rides with moving parts. Ensuring the models worked involved a lot of perseverance, as pupils had to adjust and refine their designs to make sure the parts moved as they had planned. The end result was a series of very impressive models. Well done, Year 6!
