Well done to everyone who entered the Northgate Bake Off! What an amazing collection of cakes! Please see the next two pages for more details. World Book Day Parade

World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March, and children are asked to dress up as an adjective e.g. turquoise, athletic, brave, cuddly, historic, with a label or sticker with their word on and if possible, its definition. There should be no need to buy a costume but if you already have one, can your child think of an age appropriate adjective to match it eg Harry Potter with 'courageous'. Once again there will be a World Book Day Parade, (weather permitting) where you are invited to come and see the children parade around the playgrounds. At the start of the day, the children will go to their classrooms, then parents can enter at 8.55am and wait on the Key Stage 1 or Key Stage 2 playground for the children all to come back out and parade in their costumes. Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and 2 children will walk around the Key Stage 1 playground and children in Years 3-6 will parade around their own playground. The children will walk around the lines of the netball court so it would be helpful if parents could stand inside of these lines. If you have children in both key stages, please stand under the large covered gazebo between the two. We look forward to seeing you on Thursday 7th March at 8.55am. Thank you for your continued support.

Enriching the curriculum

This week was the 'Festival of Literature' at Bishop Stortford College. On Monday, Year 1 and 2 walked down with their teachers to hear Chitra Soundar, an internationally award



winning author, read her book 'Tiger Troubles'. This is a very funny story set in the Indian jungle. The children loved hearing Chitra reading her own book! On Thursday, Year 3 and 4 heard Chris White perform mad-cap poetry from some of his books, including 'Don't Put Dave in the Microwave' and 'The Armadillo Under my Pillow'. Finally, on Friday Year 5 and 6 listened to Ross Welford who gave a lively, interactive talk about how he came up with his latest book: 'The Monkey Who Fell from the Future'. He also entertained the children by performing some story creating improvisation. What a special memory for them all!

Garg's Animal Encounters came into school to visit Year 1 on Wednesday, to get the children excited about their topic next half term 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers'. The children were able to see and learn about an array of animals including a blue-tongued skink which originates from Australia and has the most amazing blue tongue! They also encountered a lesser tenrec, which looks like a small hedgehog with soft spikes. This interesting creature is not actually related to the hedgehog family at all, but is a close relative of the elephant! All the children really enjoyed getting up close to the animals and they were able to touch them if they felt brave enough.

Year 2 celebrated completing their alien reports with Publishing Parties this afternoon! Class 3 and Class 4 published their reports into class books which will be kept in the book corner and enjoyed by all children. The classes celebrated being published authors by reading each other's reports and enjoying some delicious snacks and cakes, courtesy of the fabulous Northgate Bake Off entries! We discussed how authors

will often have launch parties for their books, and some children have made it their goal to have books published when they are older. We are so proud of the children's amazing writing, and can't wait to see if any of them go on to become authors later in life.
