Safeguarding

Medicines

All medicines e.g. auto-injectors, inhalers, piriton, etc. **MUST** be collected from school on Tuesday and their **expiry dates need to be checked** to make sure they are replaced, if necessary, for September.

If your child needs any medicine please be advised that it must be in its original packaging, in date and, where relevant, have the pharmacy label attached. Children must not bring medicines to school in their bags or pockets, they need to be brought in by an adult and handed in/collected to/from the school office. An 'Administration of Medication' form must be completed and handed in at the school office by the parent/carer. Forms can be obtained from the school office or can be found on the school website. Parents need to be aware of expiry dates and replace items such as inhalers and auto-injectors prior to expiry.

Art Day

The theme of this year's Art Day was sculpture. Children created some interesting and imaginative sculptures using both natural and manmade materials. They had experience of

working with natural materials found in the school environment and other materials such as clay, art-roc, wire, art straws, lolly sticks, paper plates and plastic spoons.
