Happy New Year. I hope you had a wonderful festive holiday. It has been great seeing the children settle back to the new term. We have introduced our new assembly theme based on the school values. This half term we will focus on <u>perseverance</u>, linking this to the school's work on growth mindset. A growth mindset can help to remove invisible barriers to learning' as pupils begin to realise that we can all grow in our abilities through hard work, perseverance and practice. It is an understanding that everyone is not the same, but that everyone can get better if they work at it. Research shows that parents can have a powerful impact on their children's mindsets. The language you use and the actions you take show your children what you expect. Giving children praise for working hard rather than for 'being clever', accepting mistakes as learning opportunities, and encouraging positive self-talk are all practices that will support your child with their

learning. There is a lot of information on the internet on how parents can support their children if you are interested.

We have also introduced our new learning power—reflective learner lion. This week we have had a house point focus on manners.

Thank you to everyone who has responded to the safeguarding questionnaire. The leadership team and governors will analyse the data and reflect on any issues that have arisen from it.

Safeguarding

It is helpful to understand the difference between relationship conflicts such as arguments/teasing that are irregular and <u>bullying</u> which is repeated behaviour over time by an individual or a group, which is

intentionally hurtful to another individual either physically or emotionally.

Inevitably, children will have conflict with friends and learning to manage these social situations is an important part of their emotional development. In contrast, bullying is intended to harm emotionally or physically and exerts a power imbalance. Bullying is potentially very harmful to a child, particularly if it persists. It is good to routinely talk about the tough stuff of life together. It's more likely that your child will come and tell you if they are being bullied because they will have learnt that it's OK to talk about difficult times. It is never too late to start talking!
