Safeguarding

For health and safety reasons, please do **NOT** park in or walk through the staff car park, including for breakfast and after school clubs. The entrance area is extremely busy, especially in the mornings, and we do not wish to have any accidents. Thank you.

Children are **NOT** allowed on the playground apparatus before and after school. Even if you are supervising your child, this encourages other children to go on and we have, in the past, had a serious accident at this time.

Reminders and Updates

Medicines

If your child needs any medicine please be advised that it must be in its original packaging, in date and, where relevant, have the pharmacy label attached. Children must not bring medicines to school in their bags or pockets (e.g. throat lozenges, etc.). They need to be brought in by an adult and handed in/collected to/from the school office. An Administration of Medication form must be completed and handed in at the school office by the parent/carer. Forms can be obtained from the school office or can be found on the school website. Parents need to be aware of expiry dates and replace items such as inhalers and auto-injectors prior to expiry.

School Dinners—KS2

Charge forecast letters have been sent out this week to KS2. Please ensure that you pay on School Gateway as soon as possible to ensure that you remain in credit for the rest of this half term. If you have any questions, please contact the school office.

Healthy Snacks

Please make sure your children's snacks are healthy. Crisps, biscuits and chocolate are not allowed. If these items are found, they will be returned home at the end of the day.

School Uniform

It is lovely to see the children looking so smart at the beginning of term but please remember that skirts and trousers must be smart school wear. Smart black shoes should be worn, without flashing lights. Children are not allowed to wear trainers, fashion shoes or boots.

In years 3 and 4 children can wear a shirt and tie but this is optional. In years 5 and 6 all children must wear a white shirt or a white blouse, with a school tie.

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery in school, including smart watches. Earrings are not allowed to be worn for safety reasons. Hair accessories must be in school colours, yellow or bottle green. Extreme hair cuts or hair gel/cream are not allowed. Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back.

Please remember <u>all</u> children need a coat, as they will be outside for about 45 minutes per day.

PE Kit

All children need to wear a white t-shirt with bottle green shorts and a bottle green tracksuit in the colder weather.

We appreciate your support in all these matters.

Can you also make sure all items are named. We have taken a tremendous amount of unnamed items to charity as we have been unable to return them to their rightful owners. If you lose anything, please check in the lost property boxes in the main reception area as unnamed items are discarded at the end of each month.
