
Science Fair

School Governing Body

School Governors Needed

We regularly review the make-up of the school's governing body to ensure that we have as wide a range of experience and expertise as possible to support the school and its senior leadership team. We have identified the need for two additional governors, one with a legal background who could act as a legal sounding board for the senior leadership team and governing body, as well as fulfilling the general role of a governor, and the second governor with HR/recruitment experience who can sit on the HR committee.

Governors are responsible for overseeing the management side of a school: strategy, policy, budgeting and staffing. They enable their school to run as effectively as possible, working alongside senior leaders and supporting teachers to provide excellent education to children. Being a school governor involves a commitment to attending governing body meetings - six full governing body and six committee meetings a year (please note, HR meetings take place during the school day). The committees consider issues such as setting the school vision, mitigating financial risk and scrutinising educational outcomes. Governors will visit the school to understand the way the school runs, but also at times be involved in specific projects or discuss specific issues. They also need to be prepared to complete relevant training. They are actively involved in the school community, acting as critical friends to the Headteacher and senior leaders.

We would welcome expressions of interest from a parent or anyone from the community who would like to give back and has an interest in education. If you would like to speak with a governor currently working with the school to better understand the role, please contact the School Office to arrange.
