Headteacher's News

This week we were delighted to welcome headteachers from other local schools into our classrooms as part of Envision, our local schools' partnership. Through this collaboration, schools work together to share expertise and raise the quality of education for all children in our community.

The visiting heads spent the day reviewing teaching and learning across our school, and their feedback was very positive. Some of the points they noticed included the high quality of pupils' behaviour and engagement in lessons, a well-sequenced and carefully planned curriculum, and teachers giving clear instructions and strong models to support learning. It was encouraging to have the quality of our teaching and learning validated by external colleagues. At the same time, the process gave us a valuable opportunity to learn from others and reflect on ways to develop our practice even further.

On Thursday 2nd October, the Department for Education will carry out the Autumn school census. One key figure they collect is the number of Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children taking a free school meal on that day. Please encourage your Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 child to have a school meal on Census day, even if they usually bring a packed lunch. This one day determines how much free school meal funding we receive for the entire next school year. If fewer children take a meal, we receive less funding, meaning the school may have to cover the shortfall (often running into thousands of pounds) from an already tight budget.



Class Reading Journals

To promote a love of reading, every week, one child from each class will design and write a piece in their class reading journal, showcasing a book they have read and enjoyed. Children can describe why they liked the book or share their favourite characters. This initiative encourages creativity and helps students reflect on and connect with the stories they read. By the end of the year, we will have a wonderful collection of 30 fabulous books recommended by our students themselves

Reading in EYFS







Children in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) will bring a library book home each week to encourage book exploration and responsibility for their book bags. These books will be changed weekly. We kindly ask parents to read the book with their child, discussing the story, characters, and explaining any unfamiliar vocabulary. This shared reading time is crucial in nurturing a love of reading. This week, our EYFS children met their class bird toys— Dilly and Dally Ducklings, Peter Puffin and Barney Owl. Each week, four children will take home these cuddly friends to share stories with them. <u>Little Wandle Phonics Programme</u>

At Northgate, we use the Little Wandle Phonics Programme from Nursery up to Year 2. This phonics-based approach helps young children develop strong reading skills through a structured framework that guides both parents and teachers. It ensures children can confidently decode and understand words. Families can access helpful resources on the Little Wandle website: For parents | Letters and Sounds. The website features short videos to support pronunciation, printable resources, and well-known nursery rhymes. No login is needed, making it an easy and convenient place to support your child's phonics learning at home.
