Safeguarding

Medicines

If your child needs any medicine, please be advised that it must be in its original packaging, in date and, where relevant, have the pharmacy label attached. Children must not bring medicines to school in their bags or pockets, they need to be brought in by an adult and handed in/collected to/from the school office. An 'Administration of Medication' form must be completed and handed in at the school office by the parent/carer. Forms can be obtained from the school office or can be found on the school website. Parents need to be aware of expiry dates and replace items such as inhalers and auto-injectors prior to expiry.

Newsletter

Secondary Transfer

Year 6 children will have brought home a "Secondary Transfer 2019" leaflet this week. Please be aware that applications can be made on www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions and applications **MUST** be made by 31st October 2019.

School Lunches

We are introducing a new school lunch ordering system, called School Grid, on Monday 9th September for all children. More information is being sent out via e-mail this afternoon. This new system will allow parents to make their child's menu choices from home. Don't worry if this hasn't been done though, as we are still able to make the choices with your child at school.

For children in Years 3 to 6, payment for lunches will continue to be made on School Gateway. Please note that whilst School Grid is being set up the payment link for lunches will be removed from School Gateway on the afternoon of Friday 6th September and will be back on the morning of Monday 9th September. If you are not in credit for your lunches for this half term, please can you make payment next week. Please note, the cost of a lunch has gone up to £2.60.

Payment for this half term is as follows -

Wednesdays only = £20.80 Fridays only = £20.80 Wednesdays and Friday = £41.60 Dinners every day = £98.80

Extra Curricular Music

We are very lucky as a school to have both a Choir and Orchestra club available to our KS2 children.

Uniform Reminders

It was great to see all the children looking so smart at the start of term. Just to remind you all items must be named.

Skirts and trousers must be smart school wear. The Upper Key Stage 2 children are expected to wear a shirt and tie. Ties are optional in Lower Key Stage 2.

Smart black shoes should be worn, without flashing lights (or with the lights turned off). Children are **not** allowed to wear trainers, fashion shoes or boots.

Children are **not** allowed to wear earrings or other jewellery in school. Children who have not had their earrings removed after the summer need to have a letter explaining the situation addressed to Mrs Tanner. Smart watches must not be worn in school. Hair accessories must be in school colours, yellow or bottle green. Thank you for your support.

During PE lessons, <u>all children</u> should wear bottle green shorts with their white t-shirts and a bottle green tracksuit.

Water bottles

Please could you make sure your children's water bottles measure no more than 15cm in height (with the top off) as taller bottles do not fit in the machine and this is causing regular flooding of the dining room floor. Thank you
