Enriching the Curriculum - Black History Day

Reception

This week we have been focusing on individuality and inclusivity.



We have focused our learning on the book 'All Are Welcome' by Alexandra Penfold and Suzanne Kaufman. A link of the story can be found here. The story follows a group of children through a day in their school, where everyone is welcome, no matter their race, religion or background.

Year 1

In Year one we talked about segregation and about this meaning separation. We looked at Ruby Bridges and talked about how she must have felt attending a school where she was discriminated against every day. We talked about how we would feel if we were in her position and about how fantastic our differences are.



Year 2 have been looking at Rosa Parks as their significant



individual for Black History Day. They learnt and discussed the impact that Rosa Parks had on the nationwide effort to end racial segregation of public facilities in the 1900s. Year 2 enjoyed writing a factfile on Rosa Parks and finding out about her life.

Enriching the Curriculum - Black History Day



Year 3

In Year 3 we learnt about Harriet Tubman's mission to lead as many slaves as possible to freedom. We used our knowledge of biographies to write a fact file.

Year 4

In Year 4 we discussed the significance of Elizabeth Heyrick and her passion for people being treated equally. We learnt how she campaigned for the abolition of slavery and explored people's beliefs around slavery.



Year 5

During Black History day, Year 5 linked PSHE and History,



focusing on discrimination and segregation. They focused their learning on the life of Martin Luther King and how he had an important role to play with the Civil Rights Movement. We looked at some of his famous quotes and thought about the significance of them.

Year 6

In class we watched a video on what the civil rights movement was and recorded our understanding. We then looked at Ella Baker and her role as 'the mother of the civil rights movement' The children found this

very interesting and had a detailed discussion with thoughtful insights. We then linked this to todays issues and the Black lives matter movement. We discussed the meaning and role of white privilege in society and the importance in educating people of these issues.
