We held our AGM this week and were really delighted to be able to reflect on the last year of fundraising activities that achieved an incredible **£16,900!!!** Thank you so much to everyone who has been involved in any way to help us achieve this. This money will really make a difference to the school, our children and their education. Attached to this newsletter is the Chair's Report for those that missed the AGM along with our first termly newsletter.

We also discussed the year ahead and the focus of our fundraising for 2019-20. We are committed to continuing to fund the Christmas pantos and entertainer, the Life Bus and other contributions to curriculum enrichment weeks and maintenance of our previous investments. Additionally, the school has plans to refit and update the computer suite, benefiting all children. To achieve this the PTA has been asked to contribute £12,000 over 2 years and the Committee have unanimously agreed to focus the rest of our fundraising effort on this project. This means our fundraising target for the year ahead is around **£14,000**.
