Dressed in bonnets, flat caps, waistcoats and pinafores, they experienced life as Victorian schoolchildren. The hall became a strict Victorian classroom, where pupils practised handwriting on slates, recited times tables and followed firm rules, experiencing true Victorian discipline. Pupils enjoyed a range of activities that brought history to life, comparing school life then and now. ## Enriching the Curriculum

After having to postpone their planned local walk early in the week, due to bad weather, **Year 2** finally ventured out on Thursday morning. This trip related wonderfully to their geography topic on the local area and their history focus on Victorian schools.

After carefully making their mixtures using bicarbonate of soda, vinegar, washing-up liquid and red food dye to create a fun visual representation of an eruption, the children took their volcanoes into the playground, where they watched with excitement as the mixtures overflowed and erupted. This hands-on activity helped them to deepen their understanding of volcanic eruptions while having lots of fun learning together. In English, they will shortly be writing their own newspaper reports using eyewitness accounts of the eruption.

## Reminders and Updates

### Important PE Kit Reminder

Please ensure children wear non-branded clothing for PE (apart from the school logo): a plain white T-shirt, green shorts or joggers (seasonal), and a green hoodie.
