I am mindful of your own commitments so we are delighted that the majority of children have been attending the live lessons. We understand that it may not be possible to attend live lessons on a particular day. If your child is absent for any reason, please email the class to report the absence and please ensure they have submitted the relevant work. Teachers and support staff are being asked to chase up unauthorised absence promptly.

Please help get your child into a regular working routine, including breaks away from screens and exercise. We don't want the children at their screen all day, so will be adding more movement breaks into the timetable. Drinking water is also important for their health, including for the health of their eyes.

Please do take an interest in the work they are doing, and praise them for excellent effort and good work.

If you have any connection or computer issues, please email the class straight away and please be patient as the teachers equally may have internet issues.

Finally, we would like to get some feedback about the online learning experience. Over the next couple of weeks we will be sending out a questionnaire to gain your thoughts on our current provision.

We are trying to keep our school connected as much as possible so Mrs Jones led a school council meeting today through Google Classrooms. Class representatives will feed back to their classes next week.

Google Classrooms

Please note that children must be logged into their pupil accounts to access the live lessons. For safeguarding reasons, teachers are unable to allow accounts outside of the '@northgate.herts.sch.uk' domain into the lessons as they can't be monitored.

In order to correctly access the link for live lessons, Google Classrooms must be linked to your child's school account. In some cases Google Classrooms will connect to a preexisting Google Account which has been set up on your PC/ laptop. For an easy way to check this, look for a coloured circle on the top right hand of the screen which contains a letter and which should relate to your child's school account. Click on the letter to view the linked account and update where necessary.

Key Worker Classes - Covid-19 Vigilance

If your child is coming into a school key worker class during the period of school closure, please remember to follow these important guidelines to protect our staff and pupils.

<u>Please do not send children into school if any of the</u> <u>following apply:</u>

- they have any one of the symptoms of Covid-19, a temperature of over 37.8°C, a persistent cough and/or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste.
- they, or any members of your household or support bubble, are awaiting test results or have tested positive for Covid-19.

For the national lockdown to be effective, it's important that we keep the numbers attending school as low as possible whilst allowing those who really need to be in school to have access to place.
