## **Headteacher's News**

I am delighted to announce the new class teachers for next year. We are very lucky to be gaining a new teacher, Miss Seers, plus welcoming back Mrs Aziz and Mrs Port, both of whom have worked in school with support teaching this year, and who will be covering Miss Goslitski's maternity leave. They will each bring a range of knowledge and skills to support your children's learning. We are delighted to welcome Miss Seers to Northgate. She has recently completed a degree in Primary Education and has worked in Early Years and key stage one, teaching children with a wide variety of learning needs in Harlow, London and St Albans. She is extremely excited about joining Northgate, having already spent days with Miss Stott in Reception. I hope as a school community we make them very welcome, and fingers crossed that you will have an opportunity to meet them at the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings in early September.

Our current Nursery will receive letters about their classes next week. We are extremely sad to be losing Miss Nolan, who is moving out of the area. We wish her well in her new job in the St Albans area.

The children will have the opportunity to meet their new teachers on Move Up Day, and those whose classes are being mixed will have a chance to work in their new class groups in the coming weeks.

Well done to Year 4 who have completed the new national multiplication test this week. As this was not compulsory this year, and is new, there is no pass mark and we are still unsure on what information will be available.

There are an increasing number of cases of Covid in Bishop's Stortford, and schools are starting to close bubbles again. For this reason, Herts County Council have strongly recommended that schools do not hold the traditional end of term events. I appreciate that current regulations are very confusing but bubbles do still have to isolate and I am hoping no one will have to return to online learning for the last few weeks of term. Therefore the school has made the difficult decision to follow Herts guidance and make changes to our end of term arrangements. We will try to keep as many events as possible for the children, but unfortunately parents will not be able to attend our usual events. We hope that we can give the children a really positive end of term, held in school and not online. Your co-operation to keep within the current guidance is much appreciated and, if possible, please complete regular lateral flow tests. Thank you.
